

Happy \$ were given by Austin, who asked us to sign-up for the Food for KIDZ in Stewartville on April 6th. Roger and Al were also happy, regarding the Honker program and the website volunteer information. Mary asked for a show of hands for the social time together at Whistle Binkies N next Wednesday 3/20 at 4:30 PM. She is expecting about 8 to show. Dan Moore had a story about an Irishman taking his son to the pub, with a surprise ending. Del had tickets and posters for our Pancake Breakfast on May 4th, which are \$50 for a book of 10, and Mary bought the first book

Roger introduced the program speaker about the Rochester Honker's baseball team and the plan for KIWANIS Clubs to attend on June 14th. Kayla Piltz said the NW League Mission is to enhance the quality of life in the community, and there are 22 teams, making it the largest league. Over 200 players move on to the NLB. The Honkers

started in Rochester in 1994, winning four championships in 1997, 1999, 2006, and 2009. The team President is Chris Goodell for the last 20 seasons, and the General Manager is Jay Fanta for 6 years. The Honker's share the same slogan as KIWANIS to improve the world one child at a time as very fitting for their objective, The Honker groups attending games are for the Sport's Deck, the Grandstand Patio, Victoria's Suite, Group Picnics, and Fund Raisers. Included in group events are "All you can eat" for 90 minutes (6PM to 7:30PM). Kayla allowed time for questions/comments, like the owner has two other teams, and players are hosted by now 30 + families for free lodging, who get tickets for all home games.
